The city of Lansing prohibits discrimination or harassment based on irrelevant characteristics including:

height weight religion national origin ancestry gender identity or expression marital status sex source of income student status color SEXUAL ORIENTATION

race veteran status political affiliation age status

family status mental or physical limitation



This includes discrimination in:

Employment

Housing



Public Accommodations or Services

I tried to rent an apartment in Lansing, but the landlord said I had too many kids. Can he do that?

No, he cannot. Lansing prohibits discrimination in housing based on irrelevant characteristics such as familial status.

I was not promoted. My  coworkers say this was due to my sexual orientation. Is this legal?

No, it is not. Employers are not allowed to discriminate based on one's orientation.

QUESTIONS?

Do I have to live in Lansing to file a complaint?

No, but the incident needs to have occurred within Lansing.

A restaurant refused me service because of my race. What should I do?

Contact Lansing's Department of Human Relations and Community Services. Public services cannot be refused due to race. We will help you through the next steps.
